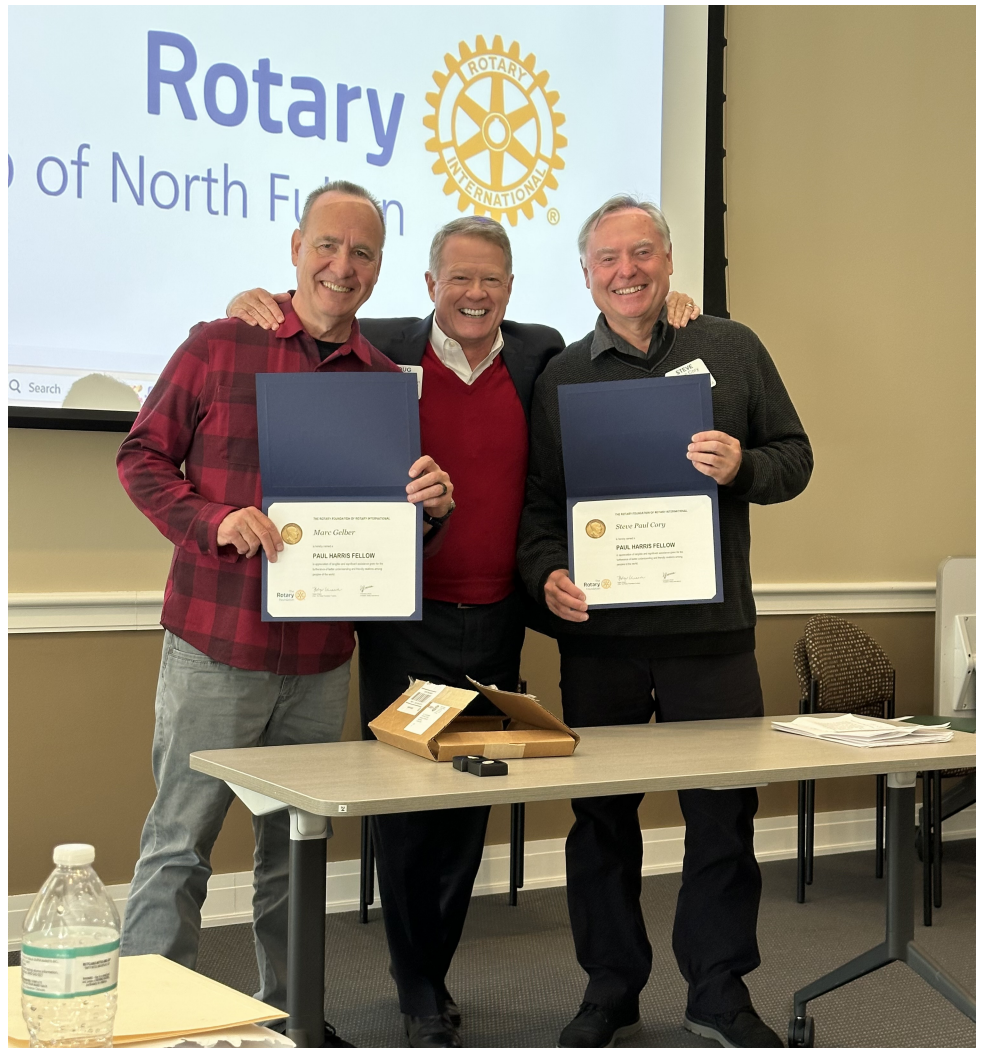

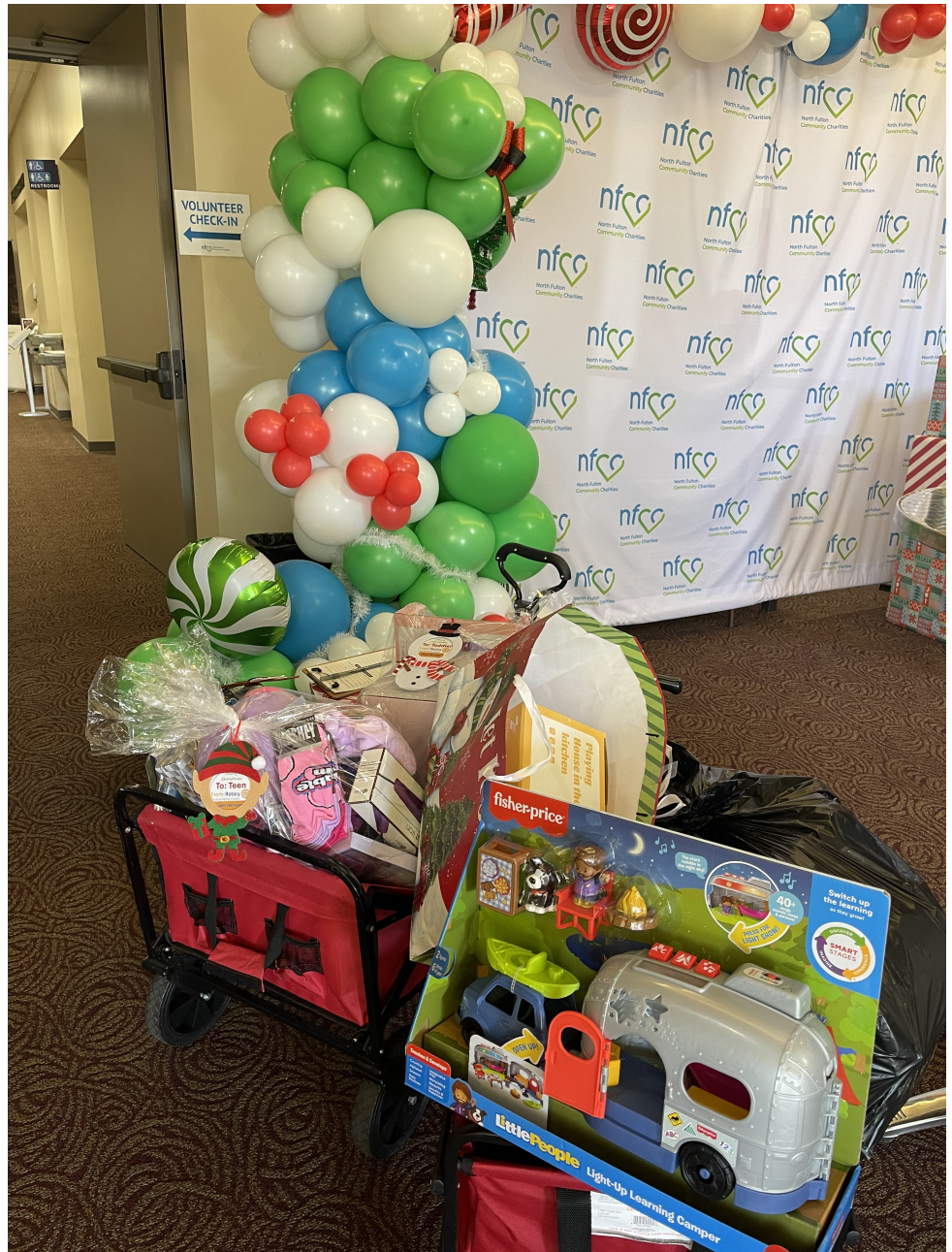




NFCC Toyland
