4. Create wins for customers first.

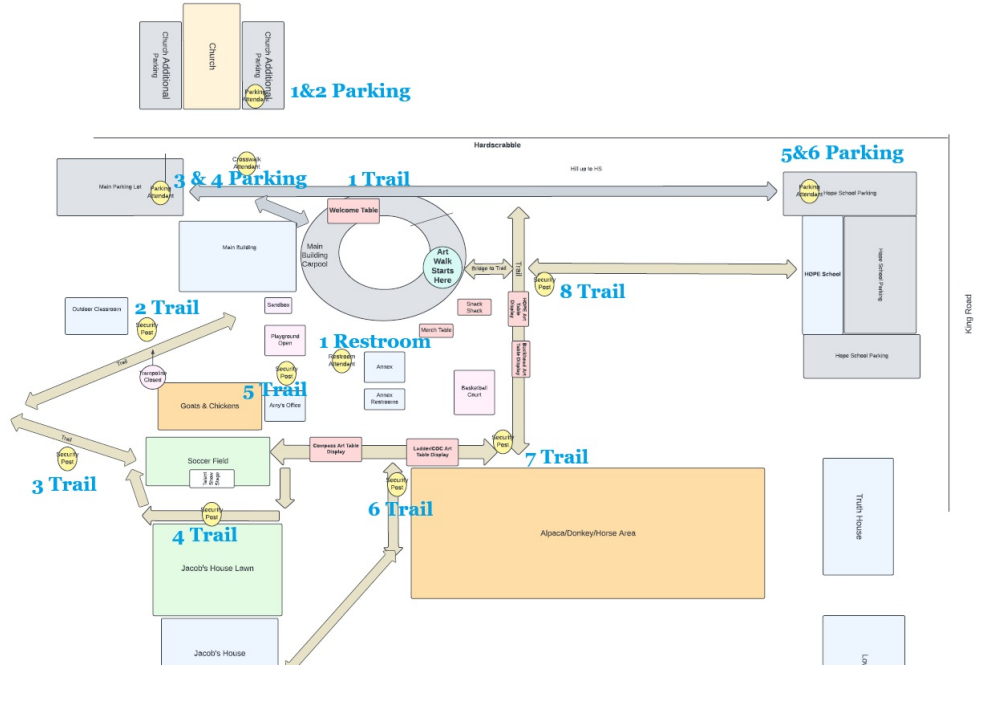


Service Project: Jacob's Ladder Art Walk & Talent Show

Kirk is a serial entrepreneur and committed servant leader and has been an active member and volunteer of the Alpharetta Rotary Club, earning honors such as "Rookie of the Year" and "Rotarian of the Year" and participating in numerous international and local service projects. Kirk served as 6900 District Governor in 2021. Kirk and his wife, Deena, live in Alpharetta's Academy Park neighborhood with their three children - Cambri, Knox, and Kolton and are members of Restoration Church. Kirk serves on the Alpharetta City Council.
